

## Pupil Premium

St Mary's currently receives Pupil Premium funding which is allocated to children from families on a low income who are currently known to be eligible for free school meals and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months. It is also used for children who have been on the FSM register but no longer qualify.

At St Mary's, the Governing body and staff value and respect each child as an individual. We strive to ensure that provision is made which secures the teaching and offers learning opportunities that meets the needs of all of our pupils. They therefore reserve the right to allocate pupil premium funding to support any pupil or groups of pupils that are legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged.
