- We have been learning to say, read and write instructions at School, making sure
 that we spot and use "imperative verbs"/"bossy words". With an adult, read
 through these instructions for Easter nests.

Draw and try to **write** your own caption for each instruction. Spot the "imperative verbs" (place, break, add, dip, heat, turn, put, keep, remove). If you have the ingredients you could then make these Easter nests, or you could draw and write down what your grown-ups do to create a different meal.

Maths

Counting carefully to 15

• Check that children can simply compare size: https://www.topmarks.co.uk/early-vears/lets-compare

We are now moving away from using language such as "biggest" or "smallest" and being more specific so children should compare and explain which object is "the longest", "the shortest", "the tallest" and begin to measure the difference between objects.

Talk about why you might want to know the how long our how tall something is, e.g to fit furniture into your house, to describe how long you might want your hair to be or to check that you are tall enough to go on a ride.

Remember that we can measure in non-standard ways such as cubes (or sticks like for the Lion in the video), as well as in standard ways such as centimetres.
 Choose 5 items around your house to measure in non-standard and then in standard measurements. Adults remind how to line up a ruler or a tape measure from Ocm alongside the object. If you are finding objects very easy to measure, your adult might suggest measuring a "thing" or person that is longer. Then play: https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/measuring-in-cm
