Greek vases usually told stories, the remnants of these ancient vases give historians lots of information about what life would have been like in Ancient Greece. The picture of the vase here shows a chariot race from the ancient Olympic games. I would like you to design a vase which either depicts a significant event in your own life (tells your life story) or perhaps you could design a coronavirus vase as if a person in ancient Greece were to have experienced lockdown! What information would you put on your vases for the archaeologists of tomorrow to discover? Be as adventurous as you like when drawing and designing your Greek vase. Maybe if you have some salt and flour at home you could make a salt dough vase and decorate it.
