Read the first activity in the booklet so that you know when to stop the clip. Watch the clip stopping and answering the questions as detailed on page 3. On our class page is a booklet of activities linked to the clip. I would recommend the following flow of lessons.

Day 1- Watch the clip and answer the questions on page 3. Complete the collective noun activity on page 4.

Day 2- Remember how we punctuate speech. Watch this clip if you need a reminder. <u>https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/clips/zvftsbk</u> Use page 6 in the booklet to plan a conversation between the vulture and the meercats. Write it up with correct punctuation.

Day 3- Why did the vulture behave like he did? Write how he may tell his story after he has been defeated at the end of the clip. Write up your work on page 7.

Day 4- Use page 12 in the planner to plan your own story told from the perspective of the meercats. Try and get adjectives, similes and fronted adverbials in your work.

Day 5- Use your plan to write your story.
