singular and plural possessive - where do I need to add an apostrophe?

Rules

- The general rule is that the possessive of a singular noun is formed by adding an apostrophe and s, whether the singular noun ends in s or not.
- Example: The dog's food is in the cupboard. (noun is dog)
- **Possessive** of a **plural noun** is formed by adding only an **apostrophe** when the **noun** ends in *s*, and by adding both an **apostrophe** and *s* when it ends in a letter other than *s*.
- Examples: The girls' P.E. bags are red.
 - The boys' P.E. bags are green.
 - The geese's feathers were covered in oil.
