Spelling

You will find a link to this week's spellings on the below page. I would like you to practice these spellings for 20 – 30 minutes each day. I have put below how I would like you to practice your spellings each day.

Mon - Say, cover, write, check.

For all the words on our list. Do not rush them and do not forget your handwriting. Try to be an EAT learner by thinking which ones you are finding trickier. Concentrate more upon those words.

Tues - Make a glossary of the words.

It is important that you know exactly what the words mean so that you can use them in your writing. Use this website Thesaurus and Word Tools | WordHippo select -meaning of- from the drop-down menu and create a glossary for each of your words.

Wed - Use each word in a complex sentence.

Now you know the meaning of all your words, use them in a complex sentence. Write a complex sentence for each word. Can you start each sentence differently and use a a range of sentence starters?

Thurs - Make a wordsearch using your spelling words.

Remember to put your spelling words into the wordsearch first and then fill the empty spaces with letters. You could give your wordsearch to someone at home to solve or email me a picture of it and I will have a go at solving it!

Fri – Spelling Test

If there is someone at home to help you, ask them to test you on your spellings. Please further practice the spellings you get incorrect. Remember, it is more important that you have practised! I will be really proud of anyone who has practised the words each day! Please email me if you manage this!

- Many products in our shops are made from raw materials imported from poor countries in Africa, Asia, Latin America and the Caribbean Islands.

Activity:

1. Using the PDF on the class page, you will find 5 different groups of people that are part of the 'chain' of getting a banana into a supermarket for us to buy.

A banana costs 30p.

Read the information about the plantation owner, banana worker, shipper, shops and supermarkets and importer and ripener.

2. Using the 'Banana Split' on the PDF and decide how much each person should get from the 30p.

I would like you to then give reasons for who you think should get the most money and who should get the least amount of money.

3. Using the 'Answers Sheet' explore how much the workers actually get.

Answer these questions: Do you agree? Why? Which part(s) do you agree/disagree with?

Read and explore the idea of 'Fairtrade' and the importance of it on the answers sheet.

History – The Anglo Saxons

LO – To know how, when and where the Anglo-Saxons invaded Britain

On our class page, is a PowerPoint all about how, when and where the Anglo-Saxons invaded Briton. It starts with the Romans having to leave Britain to protect their home country leaving the Britons in charge. The Picts and Scots were a constant threat to the Britons. Therefore, this lesson explored what the British King at the time (King Vortigern) did to protect his country and what the Anglo-Saxons did to invade Briton.
