Spelling – Every Morning

You will find a link to this week's spellings on the below page. I would like you to practice these spellings for 20 – 30 minutes each day. I have put below how I would like you to practice your spellings each day.

Mon - Say, cover, write, check.

For all the words on our list. Do not rush them and do not forget your handwriting. Try to be an EAT learner by thinking which ones you are finding trickier. Concentrate more upon those words.

Tues - Make a glossary of the words.

It is important that you know exactly what the words mean so that you can use them in your writing. Use this website [Thesaurus and Word Tools | WordHippo](#) select -meaning of- from the drop-down menu and create a glossary for each of your words.

Wed - Use each word in a complex sentence.

Now you know the meaning of all your words, use them in a complex sentence. Write a complex sentence for each word. Can you start each sentence differently and use a range of sentence starters?

Thurs - Make a wordsearch using your spelling words.

Remember to put your spelling words into the wordsearch first and then fill the empty spaces with letters. You could give your wordsearch to someone at home to solve or email me a picture of it and I will have a go at solving it!

Fri – Spelling Test and extra list of homophones

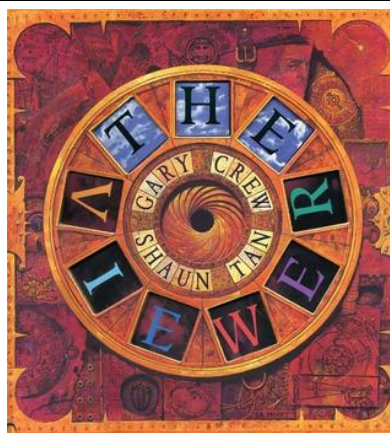

This week, we will continue to focus on 'The Viewer' by Gary Crew. I hope you are enjoying this book as much as me!

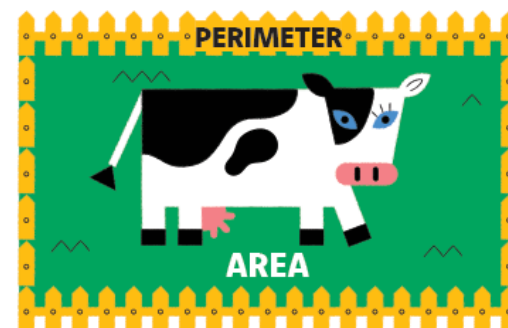
We are going to continue to use the Oak academy website for our Literacy. These lessons require you to have a pencil and paper ready before you start the clip.

History – The Anglo Saxons -

Monday Afternoon



LO – To know what an Anglo-Saxon village was like and explore what everyday life was like there

The Anglo-Saxons preferred to live very differently to the Romans who had established large towns in Britain during their rule. Places like London, which were thriving centres under the Romans became much smaller and quieter during the Anglo-Saxon times, and some towns were completely abandoned and the buildings were left to go to ruin.

- The Anglo-Saxons chose to live in small villages instead, which were often set up by clearing away a part of a forest.
- The Anglo-Saxons lived in family houses which were built around a central hall where the village chief lived.

RE – Wednesday Afternoon

This week, we Will be continuing our RE unit based on 'Justice for the good of all'.

LO – To explore how God sent Jesus to bring the good news to everyone

Science-Thursday Afternoon

LO - I know what light is and where it comes from

In this lesson, we are going to be learning about light. We are going to learn about what light is, where it comes from and how shadows are formed. We are going to complete an investigation into how light behaves with transparent, translucent and opaque objects. You will need a piece of paper and a pencil for this lesson. If you would like to take part in the practical investigation you will need: a light source (e.g. lamp, torch or phone light), a piece of paper, a piece of cardboard and a piece of something transparent (e.g. clear plastic). If you do not have these items you can still complete the lesson by watching the teacher's demonstration.

Remember to click through all the sections of the lesson and complete the final quiz at the end!



Hot – Create a heading, illustration and description for a magazine about what the world would look now if all people lived out the Good News of justice that Jesus spoke about.

Use a heading like; 'God sent me to bring the Good News' and draw an illustration with a paragraph description of how our world would look if the advice was fully lived out to make our world a better place.

Hotter – Imagine you have been chosen to speak on Radio 4's 'Thought of the Day' session. I would like you to write a speech to persuade people to follow the word of Jesus and to make our world a more just and fairer place. What would our world look like now if we all followed the word of Jesus? What wrong choices would people no longer be making? Who would be better off? Eg. the homeless

In your speech, remember your persuasive techniques.
