Today's learning - LO - To explain choices using evidence. To use expanded noun phrases to describe

Now read about Key Inventions in History. I have put the PDF for this document on our class page.

<u>Activity</u>- Based on what you have just read, select the invention you think is the most important from the text. Write down which invention you have chosen, a short description of it and why you think it is the most important. Remember your writing skills when you are doing this. Start your sentences in different ways and try to include some expanded noun phrases to describe the invention.

Maths (60 Minutes)

This week, we will be trialling using 'White Rose Hub' for our Maths learning. There is a video to watch each day which clearly explains the Maths learning for that session. After watching the video, there is an activity to have a go at based on that day's learning objective. You will not need to print the maths off and you can just answer the questions using a piece of paper and a pencil. The questions get harder each time so the last few questions involve problems and so should be a bit more challenging.

We will be looking at 'Fractions'. Some lessons might be a recap for you or some might be new content. Please let me know how you get on!

LO – To explore how Jesus taught us to live justly in the world

Watch the Parable of the Sheep and Goat here - https://youtu.be/iWSkdx-XwWY

This parable is about how God will judge everybody at the end of time. Jesus tells us when we look after one another, we have looked after him. This parable is about living justly and caring for everyone in our world.

Think: What is CAFOD doing to make the world a better and just place?

Jesus showed us a just way to live. What does it mean to live justly in your home, school, parish and local community?

Activity -

- 1. Have a look through the images of 'living justly' on our class page. Decide if each image shows living justly or unjustly. Why is is important that we all deserve to live justly?
- 2. Hot = Thinking about the people that are vulnerable or in need as they are living in unjust circumstances, I would like you to create a persuasive poster to put up in our local area to suggest why we should support these people. On your poster, as well as explaining why we should help, I would also like you to show/explain HOW we could help (what could we do?). On your poster, remember your persuasive techniques- powerful and emotive sentences, facts, rhetorical questions etc. Also, make your poster bright, colourful and eye-catching!
- 3. Hotter = Thinking about the people that are vulnerable or in need as they are living in unjust circumstances, I would like you to write a persuasive letter to Mrs Brogden to suggest why as a school, we should support these people. In your letter as well as telling Mrs Brogden WHY we should support the people in unjust situations, I would like to think HOW we could support them? What could we do to help? In your letter, remember your persuasive techniques such as: rhetorical questions, powerful adjectives/statements, emotive sentences, relative clauses etc.

Daily Wellbeing- (15 minutes)

Read the comic about Tim Berners-Lee, the man who created the World Wide Web.

I have downloaded it and put the PDF on our class page for you to read.

Activity - Once you have read the comic, write a short biography about Tim Berners-Lee's life.

Remember to write your biography in chronological order (from his birth up until most recent times), selecting the key dates and facts about his life. Try to start your sentences differently and add colour and illustrations to your biography to engage the reader. Can you set it out in an interesting way? Remember to read back through your work to check for spelling and punctuation.

History- (60 minutes) (If you want to choose another topic lesson to complete today that is fine, look at the other green topic lessons for the week!)

LO – To explore and analyse Anglo-Saxon artefacts

I would like you to start today's history lesson by answering these questions:

- Why do you think it is a historians job to 'dig up the past'?
- What is archaeology?

Explore the first slide on the PowerPoint about why it is important to use artefacts to form conclusions about the Anglo-Saxons.

Activity -

On the PowerPoint, are 3 images of items that have been found and dug up from the Anglo-Saxon period. Using the template that I have put on the class page (you do not need to print it. You could set it out on your piece of paper like this), I would like you to choose 2 of the artefacts and draw each one in the middle of a piece of paper – make sure you focus on the details of each piece and add colour if you have colours at home. Each artefact should be on a new piece of paper.

I would like you to then create an archaeologist report on each artefact. To do this, you need to answer the questions below around each piece of. Remember to answer in full sentences, explain why using 'because/since/as' etc and include as much detail as possible to make a detailed report.

- 1. What do you think the object is? Explain why.
- 2. Who do you think in the Anglo-Saxon period would have used this item? Explain why.
- 3. Where do you think the object was found? Explain why.
- 4. What do you think it is made from? Explain why.
- 5. What do you think it teaches us about Anglo-Saxon life? Explain why.
- 6. Have you got any other observations about the artefact? Explain why.

<u>Extra activity</u> – choose one of your artefacts. Google search what you think it is eg. 'Anglo-Saxon ring'. Did you get your prediction correct? Add any extra facts that you learnt about your item around your archaeologist report – preferably in a different colour if you have one at home.

<u>Activity</u> - Imagine you are to write about the discovery of potato chips in a similar style to the article you read at the start of this session.

Write your version of the discovery of potato chips using the same format as this article, such as: selecting your main title, using the sub-headings 'The 'Oops' Moment' and 'The Details' with a short description and finally a sub-title for the discovery and a short explanation. Remember to start your sentences differently and add colour and illustrations. Read back through to check for spelling and punctuation.


Spelling (30 minutes)

LO – To explore what reflection is and how we can use it.

In this lesson, we will be learning about reflection! We will learn about reflective and non-reflective materials and their uses. Then we will look at two different types of reflection: specular and diffuse reflection. After that, we will learn the law of reflection. <u>Today's learning</u> - <u>LO – To write an advertisement for an in</u>vention

Based on all the inventions you have looked at throughout the week, select your favourite one.

Activity -

Imagine you have been asked to create an advertisement to sell this invention on the TV, in a similar way to Shouty Man on Horrible Histories. If you are unfamiliar with Shouty Man, a compilation of his adverts can be found here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=R7ZkNvMMAfw

Write a script for your advert. Think about including persuasive features in your script such as: the invention benefits, rhetorical questions, relative clauses, appealing adjectives, a snappy slogan, facts and offers. If possible, once you have written your script, you may choose to video the advert to email to me (I would love to see this!!).

<u>LO – To design an Anglo-Saxon outfit</u>

Activity -

Using the information you have read, design an everyday outfit to wear as an Anglo-Saxon. You can design a male or female outfit – it is your choice. Colour your outfit in if you have colours at

home. Label the different parts of your outfit and write a few sentences to explain why you have designed this particular outfit.

Consider all that you have achieved this week. What are you most proud of yourself for achieving? Make a list or discuss with an adult what has made you proud this week.
