Change of school day... DfE requirements - IMPORTANT

Dear Families. As you aware, for a number of weeks now we have been consulting on the options for amendments to the school day in line with the DFE requirements.

Finding a solution that suits everyone is challenging, hence we asked for/ invited Parental views and input and ultimately, the decision made will be driven by what would benefit the children academically. The school is asked by the Governors to consider how the additional time will be used in the context of School Improvement Priorities.

It has been brought to my attention that a Parental Questionnaire has been created and as such shared via various WhatsApp Forums/ Groups. I must make this clear that this is not an official school consultation tool. This has not been created on behalf of or with the permission of the Governors.

School would never share questionnaires/ information via WhatsApp. School will continue to share materials through formal channels such as the Newsletter, Website, Teachers2Parents text messaging service and the See Saw App.

Therefore, the information created by someone externally to the school, whether this be a Parent/ Carer or otherwise, will not be accepted and will not form part of our consultation.

As I have already communicated, you can share your views in person, via email, via the telephone; we operate, and have always operated an Open Door Policy. Myself and the whole staff are available to take on-board any views, as indeed we are with any school matter.

A consultation is not a 'vote', is it an opportunity to gather views from ALL relevant consultees and these are presented to the Governors. It is the Governors that will ultimately make the decision based on what they deem to be in the best interests of those at St. Mary's Catholic Primary School.

Year 3 trip to Martin Mere

On Tuesday 9th July, Class 3 visited Martin Mere Wetland Centre, one of over 40 wetland centres in the UK. We were greeted by Jane, who showed us to our very own classroom for the day and then guided us through our pond dipping experience. We learnt about the different creatures that lived in this habitat, as well as learn about how wetland centres help save and home different insects and animals. We used nets to make a figure 8 in the pond to capture all sorts of creatures from the ponds including: pond skaters, leeches, water boatmen, beetle larvae, newts, snails and many more. We placed what we had caught in the nets into a tray and then took them to the outdoor classroom to look at them more closely under magnifying glasses and microscopes; we then had a chance to learn more about the food chains in our ponds and also sketch what we had caught.

Louisa- My favourite part was seeing the different types of birds at the wetland centre.

Harry S- My favourite part was using the nets in the pond to catch different creatures.

Violet-I liked looking at the creatures under the microscopes and magnifying glasses to get a closer look.

Maxwell- I liked seeing the giant beetle larvae that likes to eat all of the other creatures in the pond.
