It has been very successful and has really grown. ## **Parents Evening**

The Autumn Parents evening has been set for Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> October. Please do come along and use this invaluable opportunity to discuss your child's progress with their class teacher(s). Signing up sheets are in the Entrance Foyer. If you still haven't made an appointment please pop in to do so.

## **Poor Weather**

As the Weather begins to change could we ask that all children have a suitable coat and/ or waterproof in school for breaks and lunchtime. Occasionally PE lessons will take place outside and children will need a spare jumper and, in line with our uniform policy, may wear Navy jogging bottoms. Thank you for your co-operation.

## **Medication in School**

As the weather begins to change it is inevitable we have a number of bugs and illnesses and as a consequence an increased amount of medication in school. A full copy of our medication policy is available and should you require any further information please ask a staff member. As ever, we wish to work closely with you to ensure we can enable pupils to attend school when well enough and to sustain regular attendance.

Below are some key points about administration of medication in school;

- Medication can only be accepted if prescribed by a Doctor (must have a dispensing label with the child's name) and received in the original packaging with the original leaflet. For medication without a box the bottle must have the information leaflet/ label attached

-Medication can only be administered if the appropriate paperwork has been completed and needs to be handed into the office and collected by an adult

- Medication such as Antibiotics can only be administered in school if stated that it should be given 4 times a day and we will only administer this once daily

- For new medications the first dose must be given by the parent/carer and they must observe for 15 minutes to ensure no reactions

- New advice states all pupils under 12 with an Asthma Inhaler should have a Spacer in school. Could we ask families to please send spacers into school? These should be labelled with your child's name and be in their original box to keep it clean.

#### **Supervision and Collection**

May we ask for your continued support and co-operation in ensuring the safety and well being of all pupils both at the start and end of the school day.

Staff will be on the yard from 8.45 to collect pupils. Before this time pupils are not supervised.

At the end of the school day all families are asked to come into the school grounds to collect pupils. Pupils will not be allowed to leave the playground without an adult even if that adult may be visible across the road or behind the railings. As you will appreciate the pavements and roads can get very busy with passing traffic and as such accidents could happen. We thank you for your support and understanding.

#### School Reading books

Thank you for your support in ensuring we had all reading books in school in order to update our system. We have ' Book Banded' all our scheme books to provide more variety and challenge. A separate leaflet has been sent which details the book banding system. Mrs. Shoulder, our Literacy co-ordinator will hold an informal drop in session straight after school on Monday 1<sup>st</sup> of October should you have any specific questions, but as ever, we operate an 'Open Door' system and all staff are available in the mean time if you require any further information.
