Maths

Doubling and recognising symmetry

Ladybirds have the same number of spots on each side of their backs. This means that they are "Symmetrical" or equal on both sides.

<u>R.E</u>

Adults remind of the joy that we felt last week knowing that Jesus is alive. Explain that we are now going to carry of reading another part of the story from the Bible, known as "The Road to Emmaus".

- Read through the 'Road to Emmaus' Powerpoint
- Discuss these questions:

Who can remember where the two friends of Jesus were going? · How were they feeling? Why? · Who joined them on their walk? · Did the friends know who it was? · What did they tell Jesus? · What did Jesus tell them? · When it was getting late what did they ask Jesus to do? · When they were at the table, what did the two friends discover? · What happened next? · How did they feel now?

Draw and label the clue that made them realise it was Jesus: He broke the bread and shared it! (This reminded them of the Last Supper)
