Return to School from 8.3.21

Classes will remain in Bubbles with staggered start and finish times. The plan will be largely similar to the structure we had in place before Christmas. ** Please note in order to keep everyone safe it is NOT possible to cross Bubbles so your child may only attend the club specific to their class**

<u>Lateral Flow Testing for households, Support Bubbles and Childcare</u> Bubbles of Pupils and Staff

As I am sure you will be aware the Government have a testing system in place within schools. At present within Primary Schools only staff have been invited to engage with twice weekly Lateral Flow Testing (LFT). From 1st March the Government are extending the testing to families of Primary aged pupils. For full details see the link below.

From 1 March 2021, if you're a member of a household, childcare bubble or support bubble of staff or a pupil you can get a twice-weekly test:

- through your employer if they offer testing to employees
- at a local test site
- by collecting a home test kit from a test site
- by ordering a home test kit online

At present, as a school, we do not have any facilities to provide kits to families.

** PLEASE NOTE - LFT tests (Lateral Flow Tests) do not replace the need for a PCR tests (polymerase chain reaction) test and should your child or a member of the household or Bubbles develop symptoms families must still isolate and seek a test **

Reading Books in School

We have worked hard to ensure the items transferred between home and school are minimal to help reduce the transmission of the virus. Changes such as online newsletters, no school bags etc. being a few of the measures taken to date. We know that pupils, especially our younger pupils, have missed having a physical book so from the second week back w.c. 15.3.21 we will trial physical reading books in Key Stage 1.

In order to keep everyone safe we will have a number of measures in place.

- Books must be returned on a Monday morning ONLY
- Staff will collect these books in a box (which will then quarantine before being put back into our reading stocks for future use)
- New books will be issued the same day (these will have been in quarantine for the appropriate amount of time)
- Pupils will return books and receive a new book each MONDAY ONLY.
- Staff will keep a record of the books issued.

In order to keep everyone safe we will be unable to offer any exception to this procedure. Should you forget to return a book on the Monday pupils would have to keep that book until the following Monday.

We thank you for your continued support and understanding. As ever, we will continue to review our procedures in line with guidance.
