Prayer Area



We have made a considerable investment in resources to further develop learning outside the classroom and are passionate about becoming a Forest School. Mrs Jennings is our Early Years lead and is completing the official Forest Schools qualification. We will be looking to further enhance an area of our school field and as such are looking for any willing volunteers.

Perhaps you have an hour or two to weed, remove rotten Wood or have contacts that can get us donations of bits and bobs? Over the next few weeks Mrs. Jennings will share any requests for items as she undertakes her training. We hope to roll Forest School across all our classes in the future and want to create unique learning opportunities for all children beyond the classroom.

"I am very excited to be embarking on the Forest School training and look forward to implementing the child-led, play-based ethos that offers children regular opportunities to succeed, improve self-esteem and develop as an individual through hands-on learning in a natural setting. Forest School sessions help to stimulate creativity, build confidence and teach children new skills via activities such as shelter-building, green wood-working, natural art and fire-lighting. School Dinners

From Monday 7^{th} June 2021 it will be necessary to increase the cost of our school meals from £2.20 per day to £2.35. We have not increased the cost of meals for a considerable time and as the rising costs are passed on to us this small increase is unavoidable. Pupils in Key Stage 1 (Years - Reception, One and Two) will continue to be entitled to a daily Universal Free School meal as will pupils eligible for Free School meals.
