



Learning about God and his teachings.

We would like to share with you what your child is learning in Religious Education. This information will be shared with you each half term.

Class 1: Neighbours (CAFOD unit) The children will learn to know and understand that everyone is our neighbour and is loved by God. They will look at the story of the Good Samaritan and the implications of being global neighbours. They will look at ways in which Christian families and parishes show care for one another.



Class 3: Special Places (CAFOD unit)

In class 3, children will learn about how the Christian community has many special places: places where people gather for prayer and worship; these places are holy because of their association with Jesus or holy people and they will learn about places of pilgrimage. Below are the three assessment focuses for RE and the skill areas the children will develop. The topics for each class for this half-term are displayed on this page.

Class 2: Neighbours (CAFOD unit)

Through an exploration of the question 'who is my neighbour?' the children will learn how everyone is loved by God. We will learn relevant scripture references that teach us how we should treat our neighbours, following Jesus' teachings.



Class 4: Stewardship (CAFOD unit)

In class 4, the children will learn that as a Christian, they have a duty to care for the earth. They will refer to the bible for guidance, for example, Genesis 1:26-31.
