#### **Class 3 – Ribchester – 25.5.22**

On Wednesday 25th May 2022, Class 3 set off on their second trip to the Ribchester Roman Museum.

When we arrived at the museum, we were introduced to the curator, Patrick, who introduced himself and then began to test our knowledge about what we had learnt in class. He was very impressed!

After testing our knowledge, he then showed us some artefacts (real items that were over 2000 years old!), these included pottery from under the Mediterranean Sea, sandals used by Roman soldiers (copies), mosaic tile, oil lamp and handles from different pots used by the Romans. Then... Out came the armour!

Finney and Ella M were chosen to dress up as a horse guard cavalry soldier and a soldier. Finney had to wear chainmail, helmet, shield and spear and also a parade mask. Ella M wore a chest plate, helmet with feathers on top, shield and a sword.

After having a chance to try on the armour and march up and down the room, we walked around the back of the museum to see the remains of Roman granaries, which were dug up over 100 years ago by archaeologists.

#### Uniform

As we are now in the summer term, as has been shared previously, all pupils should now be in summer uniform. This is the case at most schools and the transition into one type of uniform during this summer term creates consistency. I thank you for ensuring pupils look smart and are 'the best they can be'.

Our uniform reflects the very high standards and expectations we have for all at St. Mary's and your support is greatly appreciated.

Full details of our correct school uniform can be found on our school website. For your convenience the uniform details are also listed below.

As you be aware we are in our transition period and as such I detail the uniform for both versions.

## Current/ Old Uniform

Blue polo shirt. Sweatshirt or cardigan. Grey knee length tailored shorts. Grey ankle socks. Black school shoes.

<u>Light blue</u> checked dress. Sweatshirt or cardigan. White ankle socks and black school shoes.

# <u>New Uniform – Statutory from September - Transition period at present.</u>

Short sleeved shirt with tie. Jumper or cardigan. Tailored grey shorts. Grey ankle socks. Black school shoes

<u>Light blue</u> checked dress. Cardigan or jumper. White ankle socks. Black school shoes.

Only summer dresses are permitted and not checked shorts or skorts.

Please note: Long hair must be tied back. Hair accessories must be in school colours only. Trainers are not permitted. Pupils will be asked to change into PE pumps and loaned items from lost property if the appropriate items are not worn.

Any exceptions to the uniform for religious/ medical purposes must be discussed in advance with myself.

All pupils are required to be in full uniform – So, for example, if pupils are in the new uniform they must wear a tie at all times. Shirts must be buttoned and tucked in. Thank you for working with us to ensure all pupils are in our correct uniform and feel proud to be the best they can be!

## **Breakfast and After School Club**

A reminder as we find that demand for Breakfast and After School Club places increases – We do require the forms to be completed and payment received in advance of any bookings. This enables us to plan ahead and on busier days organise 2 staff members ensuring we have the correct ratio.

Booking are only secure once payment has been made. Pupils will NOT be able to attend unless payment has been made in advance. If you do need to book a short notice session please call the office to enable us to check availability.

Our clubs are run on a non-profit basis to provide a service to our families. If we do not receive payments in advance and have outstanding payments due we will not be able to continue to run our clubs.
