



# Curriculum RE

## Learning about God and his teachings.

We would like to share with you what your child is learning in Religious Education. This information will be sent to you each half term.

### **Class 1: The Church**

We will learn that the Church is the family of God and that we can all belong to it. We will reflect on the ways in which people pray in Church and look at the role of the priest in the love and service of God's family. We will look at Jesus' prayer to the Father and the Church's celebration of Sunday as a special day.



### **Class 3: Belonging to the Church**

We will be learning about the different types of communities and how each person in a community has a job. We will focus on what it means to belong to the community of the Church, for example that we join the Church when we are baptised. We will look at the Creed and how it states what we believe and learn about the important celebrations in the Church.

### **Class 2: The Church is born**

We will learn what happened to the disciples after Jesus ascended into Heaven. This will include learning about Pentecost and how the Apostles set up the Church through spreading the Good News. The children will hear stories from the Acts of the Apostles and consider how the Holy Spirit can help us in our lives.



### **Class 4: Called to Serve**

We will be looking at how the school community has opportunities to be 'good news' for others. We will look at the life and growth of the first Christian communities and also 'being Church' in the parish, diocese and the universal Church. We will also look at ways of taking part in the life and worship of the domestic and local Church.

Y6 children will be following the 'Life to the Full' Sex and Relationships Education Programme.
