<u>Uniform and PE kits</u>

Thank you for ensuring pupils return punctually and smartly ready to '*Be the Best they can be!*' We continue to hold the highest expectations for all pupils in all areas of school life and so expect that all pupils will follow our uniform policy.

<u>Uniform</u>

I remind all families that all pupils must be in their <u>full uniform</u>. Ties must be worn. Trainers are not permitted unless a medical need requires this and permission must be sought.

<u>PE Kits</u>

For Health and Hygiene reasons pupils must change into a full PE kit and should have PE kits in school every day. Pupils must wear uniformed items and not logo or sportswear items such as tracksuit bottoms. Pumps must be worn. Trainers may be worn for outdoor PE sessions. Failure to have a PE kit in school will mean that pupils are unable to take part in this statutory and enjoyable part of the curriculum.

Long hair must be tied back and hair accessories must be in school colours.

We remain in our 'winter' uniform until Easter.

Forest Schools

For Key Stage One pupils on their 'Forest School' days, pupils should come into school already wearing their Forest School clothes. We ask that pupils come into school wearing trainers or walking boots only (not casual boots/ heeled boots). Pupils may carry wellies into school in a named carrier bag or leave these in school.

See Saw


Just a reminder See Saw is designed to share pictures/ snapshots of learning and will not necessarily be used/checked daily.


If you do need to get a message to us – such as an absence, a change to who is picking up etc. We ask you to call the school office on 01772 729881 so that important messages are not missed.

<u>Social Media Sites</u>

We have been made aware of a number of pupils using Social media sites and posting upon these and/ or engaging in group chats. Whilst this takes place outside of school, as you will appreciate it can impact significantly upon learning and wellbeing within the school day. Once again I would remind families of the need to be vigilant of age appropriate materials and age restrictions within certain sites/ forums. Often children may be unaware of risks, cyber bullying and will need your support and guidance. I thank you for your support and cooperation.
