✓ There are 7 continents on Earth- these are North America, South America, Europe, Asia, Africa, Australasia and Antarctica

✓ There are 5 oceans around the earth- these are Atlantic

Ocean, Pacific Ocean, Indian Ocean, Southern Ocean and Arctic Ocean

 $\checkmark$  The Atlantic is the largest ocean in the world.

✓ Asia is the largest continent in the world.

✓ Human features are things made by humans- these can include buildings, roads, vehicles and bridges.

✓ Physical features are naturally made-these include forests, cliffs, caves and rocks.

✓ An Ordnance Survey map is a very detailed map of a place in the UK.

✓ There are many symbols on an Ordnance Survey map that tell you what is in a particular place.

## Vocabulary

Continent- a very large area of land that is made up of different countries.

Ocean- a large area of salt water.

Country- an individual place within a continent. Population- the number of people that live in a particular place.

Human feature - a feature that has been made or changed by humans e.g. bridge.

Physical feature - a feature that has been made by nature or naturally e.g. forest.

Compare- to look at 2 or more different places and identify things that are the same and different.

Similarities - something that is the same in 2 places. Differences- something that is different about 2 places.

Compass- a tool used to identify a direction of travel. Direction/s- the way you travel e.g. North, South, East, West.

Equator- an invisible line that marks the centre of the Earth.

Aerial view- when you look down from above. Climate- what the weather is like in a particular place. Capital- an important city in a country, usually where the Government works e.g. London.

Map symbol- a small picture to represent something

Ordnance Survey- a UK based company that create detailed maps of different places.

Atlas- a book that contains many different maps. Route- a way of getting from a start to an end position.
