
Sticky Knowledge



- ✓ There are seven continents around the world; these are
 North America, South America, Europe, Asia, Africa,
 Australasia and Antarctica. There are five oceans around
 the world; these are Pacific Ocean, Atlantic Ocean,
 Indian Ocean, Arctic Ocean and Southern Ocean.
- ✓ The Lake District is home to the wettest place in Britain, Seathwaite, and receives about 140 inches of rain a year.
- ✓ Only 41,000 people live in the Lake District National Park.
- ✓ William Wordsworth and Beatrix Potter have strong links to The Lake District.
- ✓ There are 15 National Parks in the UK.
- ✓ The Lake District is home to England's highest mountain.

Vocabulary

Map- a diagram showing the place where you are.

OS map- a map of an area showing human and physical features on it.

Leisure - time away from work

Tourists- a person who visits a place away from where they live

Atlas- a book/collection of maps.

Compass— a device used to tell the direction.

Digital Map— a map seen on a mobile device.

Easting— the lines on a map running from left to right.

Northing- the lines on a map running from bottom to top.

Gird Reference/s- a way to identify a specific area, object or place on a map.

Ordnance Survey Maps (OS Maps) - a British company who create up-to-date maps of areas in the UK.

Symbols - a picture to represent something. Human Features - buildings/objects created by humans.

Physical Features - natural objects/places created by nature.

Changes - something that is different from its original state.

History- a period of time.

Chronology- events in time/date order.

Influence/s- someone/something that enables a change/s.

Past- something that has already happened.

Present- something that is happening now.

Future- something that hasn't happened yet.

Fieldwork- work completed to answer questions.
