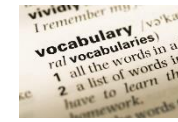
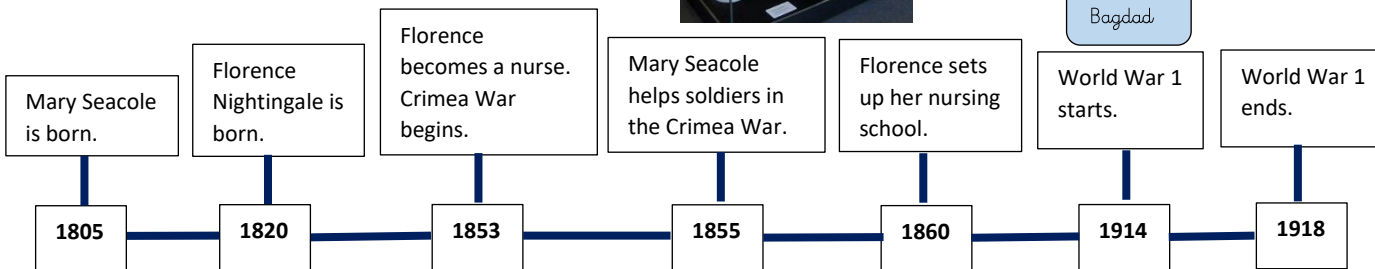
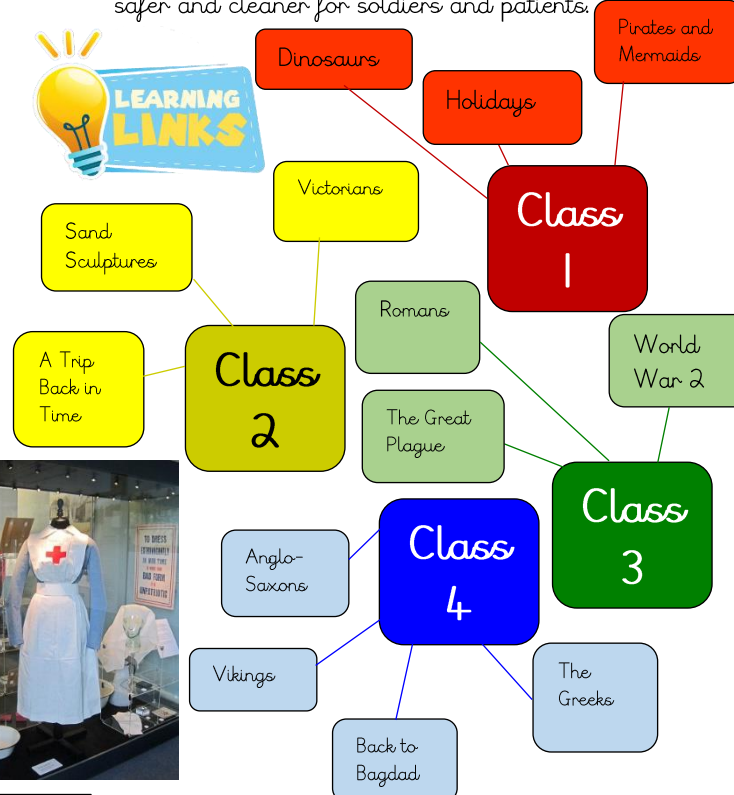
Sticky Knowledge

- ✓ Florence Nightingale was born in 1820.
- ✓ Florence became a nurse in 1853.
- ✓ Florence Nightingale is most well known for improving the conditions in hospitals during times of war.
- ✓ The Crimea War began in 1853.
- ✓ Conditions in the hospitals were not very nice.
- ✓ In 1860, Florence set up her own nursing school.
- ✓ The Crimea War ended in 1856.
- ✓ Other nurses who are associated with Florence Nightingale are Mary Seacole and Edith Cavell.
- ✓ During COVID, the army set up portable hospitals called 'Nightingale Hospitals'.



BIG Idea

When Florence first became a nurse, she was shocked by the conditions of the hospitals she worked in. Many soldiers died because they were living in dirty, damp and smelly places. Florence began to make hospitals safer and cleaner for soldiers and patients.



Vocabulary

Crimean War- (1853-1856) A war between Russia on one side and Britain, France, the Ottoman Empire (now Turkey) and Sardinia on the other.

Battlefield- A place where soldiers fight in war.

World War I- (1914-1918) First World War or World War I.

Hospital- A building where doctors and nurses take care of people who are ill or injured.

Nurse- Somebody who takes care of people who are sick or injured.

Patient/s- People who are being looked after by nurses and doctors.

Soldier- A person who is trained to fight in wars.

Conditions- What it looks like in a place.

Nursing School- A place where people train to become nurses. They are taught how to look after patients, how to take care of their wounds and make them feel better.
