








Sticky Knowledge

- ✓ World, War I 1914-1918
- World War 2 1939-1945
- During the war, men especially had to complete 'National Service' by law, in which they were trained to be combat soldiers.
- ✓ Women also completed National Service, as well as other roles such as drivers, mechanics, working in the munitions factories and many others.
- ✓ As part of the law, every household had to build an Anderson Shelter in their back garden, which was used to shelter in during The Blitze
- ✓ All lights had to be turned off at night and 'blackout curtains' placed over windows.
- ✓ Air-raid wardens would patrol the streets at night and issues warnings and fines if anyone broke the rules.
- ✓ Food very quickly became hard to buy and so rationing was.
- ✓ Over 3.5 million children were evacuated to the countryside for safety.
- ✓ Neville Chamberlain, followed by Sir Winston Churchill, were
