The Feast of St. John - 24.6.25



On Tuesday, we celebrated the Feast of St John, with everyone wearing something green to show our support, as well as learning some key facts about him.

Did you know?

The Gospel of John starts by calling Jesus "the Word." This means Jesus is like God's perfect message or communication to the world.

- The main reason this Gospel was written is so that readers "may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name." (John 20:31). It wants to help people understand who Jesus is and what he did.
- **Seven "Signs":** These are amazing miracles Jesus performed. One important sign is when Jesus brought Lazarus back to life.
- Chapter 3, verse 16, is one of the most famous verses in the entire New Testament. It says: "For God loved the world so much that He gave his only son (Jesus), so that whoever believed in Him, would not die but live forever."

Creepy Crawly Roadshow - 25.6.25

Creeping... Crawling... Fascinating... It could only mean one thing... The Creepy Crawly Roadshow was back!

Yes, to help us celebrate National Insect Week 2025, we were joined by John from The Creepy Crawly Roadshow, who brought along some more of his insect friends to meet the children and staff from St Mary's.

During each class session, the children listened to some AMAZING information and facts about these creatures, as well as having the opportunity to ask John their own questions about the Insect World. FUN FACT- did you know that nobody actually knows exactly how many species of insects there are on Earth? But it is estimated to be well over 1 million! Entomologists (those are the people who study insects), have been fascinated by the vast, wide variety of insects in just 1 species of insect for many years. Did you know there are over 50 different species of ants just in the UK?

As you can see from our photographs, some of the insect species that the children were able to hold had developed over time to either mimic their surrounds (almost camouflage like the Stick Insect) or even become colourful enough or have markings on them to scare aware predators (just like the Owl Eyed Butterfly). Some of them are poisonous out send out soul smelling odours (like a Stink Beetle) and even have spikes or spines on them to protect them in battle (like the Rhino Beetle).
