
Welcome back to our second half term. It has been lovely to welcome everyone back to school in what promises to be another action packed half term with lots of exciting Christmas events.

Parking

Once again, I wish to thank everyone for your on-going support with parking and the challenges we have faced.

We have an 'unofficial' agreement to continue parking at Westinghouse, whilst this matter is taken to Westinghouse directors and we are so grateful of their on-going consideration and support.

As you will imagine, we are doing lots behind the scenes, liaising with our Multi Academy Trust and with the Local Authority, to ensure the safety of all. There is no easy or quick fix solution.

I ask families to continue to park at Westinghouse and walk down to school.

I appreciate this is tricky when the weather is poor and when you are juggling young children, but parking on Darkinson Lane is creating a narrowing of the road, which is unsafe. It means two vehicles cannot pass and prevents access for emergency vehicles, if they are needed.

I would once more ask for your continued consideration with the Church drive, as the Sisters' drive is private and is their home. Please be mindful of not causing any blockages. The same access for any emergency vehicles is required at all times.
