We ask for your ongoing support to improve punctuality. School starts promptly at **8.45am**, which means we expect pupils to be inside ready to commence learning at this time. Typically, pupils will be brought in at 8.40am so they are in class ready to begin learning.

Anyone arriving late must be accompanied by an adult, who will be required to sign the pupil in as minutes late are recorded.

Arbor



Reminder all dinner monies MUST be paid via Arbor and cash/ cheques are no longer accepted.

After February half term we will only take booking and payments for Breakfast and After School Club via Arbor. Booking will 'go live' from w/c 2.2.26. Please note **Payment fees are Non-refundable and booking payments or dates cannot be moved.**

We will no longer be issuing paper booking forms as all booking are to be made through Arbor.

The system will record when places are full and prevent additional bookings, so please book early to avoid disappointment. The system will not allow any booking without advance payment/ a credit balance.

If you are booking using Childcare vouchers, please contact the School Office. This process is slightly different.

From 24.2.26 in order to support families, late pick up will be extended to 4.00pm and offered at the revised price of £5.00

If you have not already signed up to Arbor you will need to contact the office and request a resend link. The Link is only active for 24 hours so you will need to do this at your earliest convenience. As we move along the Arbor migration journey more will be organised through Arbor so it is really important each family has access.

As we saw in the New Year, we also saw in the commencement of a BRAND-NEW Reading initiative from the Literacy Trust, naming 2026 'The Year of Reading' and launching their Reading campaign 'Go All In'.

Their aim is simple... To increase the number of children reading every day, through promoting reading both in and out of school. CHALLENGE ACCEPTED!!

Throughout the rest of this term and in the Summer and Autumn Terms, we as a school will be taking part in a variety of activities, to promote reading across school, raise the awareness of the importance of reading, as well as share a variety of exciting, new, spooky, funny and informative stories and activities along the way. In addition to this, we have individual reading challenges for everyone in school, aiming to achieve the most 'Reading Miles' they can whilst reading- more details of this will follow soon!



Challenge 1 - National Story Telling Week – next week!!!

To kick-start our reading challenges, we will begin by joining the thousands of other schools around the country in National Story Telling Week! On Monday morning, everyone will join in their own House Teams, to begin the Reading-extravaganza, listening to a story read in each House Team Room by the teachers. Then after the allotted time, each House Team will move to the next House Team room together, to listen to a different story, until everyone has visited each classroom. Then, during our usual singing practice slot, we will gather as a whole school, to share one final story.

Then on Tuesday, each class will join many other schools from around the globe, to join in a LIVE lesson, listening to a BRAND-NEW story, read by one of the guest speakers. This year's theme is 'Reading with Music' and is sponsored by the National Literacy Trust.

After that, each class will continue their reading journeys in class and at home, through guided reading sessions, phonics lessons, shared reading, class novels and also reading at home. Our Reading Miles Challenge is based on home reading, with children earning more 'miles' the more they read- so please ensure you read every night with your child and sign in their reading record.



For more information or to book on please ask in the School Office or as a member of the Class 1 team.


Save the Date – Residential September 2026
